MAKE YOUR OWN

Swift Parrot MASK

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- Coloured craft paper (red, green, yellow, white, black & orange)
- Glue/clag
- An elastic band
- A hole punch
- Scissors

STEPS



1

Snap the QR code to download your mask template from the Member Zone.



2

Use the mask template to cut out the various shapes from each of your coloured papers.

Ensure that all eye holes are cut out (before the next step).

Always ask an adult to help with using scissors!

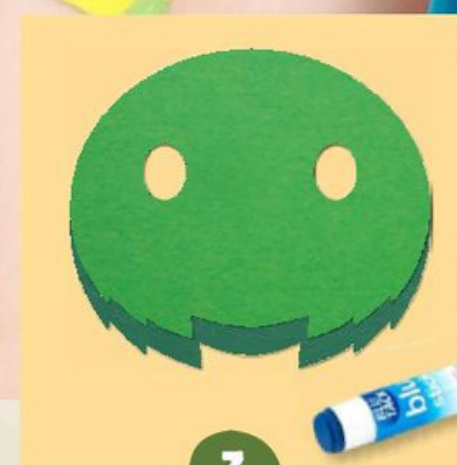

DID YOU KNOW

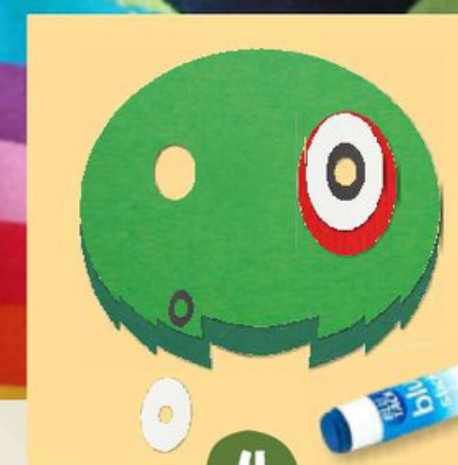
The Swift Parrot is Critically Endangered. There are just 750 birds estimated to be remaining in the wild.

See the Swift Parrot at Healesville Sanctuary and help fight its extinction.

Glue one mask base on top of the other.

Then glue each of the outer eyes (red) then the centre eyes (white) and finally, the middle eyes (black).

Finally, glue the bottom beak, followed by the top beak.

Punch holes in either side of your mask and tie elastic at either end.
